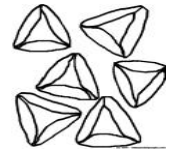

A Few Words From Our President

As of this writing, it's bitter cold out and even though it's a good night to cozy up on the couch and read a book or watch a movie, I'm looking forward to going to Temple this evening for Shabbat services. Rabbi Randi Musnitsky, the Regional Director of the Union for Reform Judaism, is our "guest" Rabbi tonight, as Rabbi Fass is out on a three-month Sabbatical. Rabbi Musnitsky is a wonderful speaker; truly dynamic and spiritual - the kind of person who makes you think and at the same time feeds your soul. We're very fortunate that she so graciously agreed to come to lead our services. We're also extremely lucky that we've had someone else leading our services here every week since Rabbi Fass began his Sabbatical in the middle of December. And that's Sally Winter.

Sally is not only a past-President of our congregation, but she's been on virtually every Temple committee known to man, is on the Regional Board of the URJ, and also happens to be a clown (no kidding; there's actually an official clown organization and everything - I think they all drive to meetings in little tiny cars). Sally's trained as a para-Rabbinic, leads Shabbat services at Sunrise assisted living home on Friday afternoons, is presently taking Torah cantillation classes, and is an incredibly proud grandmother.

Once it was decided that Rabbi Fass was going on Sabbatical, Sally was asked if she would be willing to "help out" with services. After all, she's been trained to do so, and has been leading our services in August for years when Rabbi Fass is on vacation. In true Sally

fashion, she's done way more than "help out." She's cleared her very busy calendar for three months so that she can be here with us each Friday night. She's led services on several Saturdays too, including one Saturday where she led two (count 'em, two) Havdalah services - one for a Tot Shabbat, and one for our Chai Society.

Sally puts her heart and soul into everything she does and this has been no exception. She spends hours and hours during the week reading Torah, and poring over commentaries to gain insight into each week's portion. She meets with Cantor each week to plan services, and searches for extra readings that she feels will have meaning to us. Over the last many weeks her own unique style has evolved. When she leads services for our Religious school kids, she writes special sermons for them that they can connect with, and is as comfortable with two-year olds as she is with eighty-two year olds. She leads the services with great warmth and spirit, and not only is her devotion to Judaism always evident, but she has an ability to make all of us feel the powerful connection she feels. She's one of those people who make a difference.

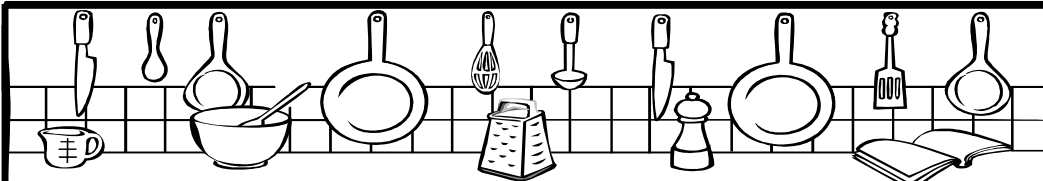

Meet the TBS Teachers . . .

It was once said that "to teach is to touch a life forever." My journey as a teacher began at the age of 20 after graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. My passion, love and enthusiasm for young children, coupled with the notion of shaping, nurturing and enriching their lives was the start of my evolving voyage as a teacher. My early years in the classroom as a pre-K and second grade teacher sparked my interest in teaching the youngest of minds; those who saw the world with innocence, intrigue and amazement. Knowing that I could be their first source of learning, their very first teacher is what started my path as an early childhood educator.

In 1978, both Rabbi Fass and my sister Ilene Levy had preschool aged sons. There was a need in the community for a Jewish preschool program. Rabbi Fass asked my sister to start a preschool holiday program. The response was overwhelming. Both Ilene and I were preschool teachers with the same religious background and education. Ilene asked me to work with her in the creation of such a program. Together, for close to ten years, sometimes as many as one hundred children per season learned about the religious holidays, the temple and Israel through story, dance, craft and trips to the sanctuary. After eight or nine years, my sister, then a temple board member was asked about starting a nursery school. We were again moving ahead with our preschoolers into the future. Fast forward and the playground was placed where it is today next to the then unused "white building" which was then renovated and became the home for the Temple Beth Sholom Nursery School. Ilene and I confirmed our childhood dream of starting a nursery school together.

Throughout my years at Temple Beth Sholom Nursery School, I have had the joy of teaching hundreds of students. Now those students are having children of their own. Seeing the cycle of learning evolve within the walls of TBSNS continues to fill me with unexplainable joy and gratification.

Some of my oldest and most prized "students" are my three children Meredith, Jodi and Daniel. Knowing that I have had the privilege of teaching them and being their mother has made my world what it is today; one filled with continuous love and learning. It is with unimaginable delight to see my oldest daughter Meredith following in my footsteps as an early childhood educator. She along with husband Victor and my first grandchild Hannah Morgan continue to inspire me. My middle daughter Jodi has chosen a similar path of molding lives but those of adolescents as a licensed clinical social worker. I am so proud to see and watch her as she grows her private practice while continuing counseling at a Westchester hospital. My youngest, my forever baby Daniel is finishing a 10 month commitment to Ameri Corp. based in Charleston, South Carolina. Watching him help those in need, not expecting anything in return warms my heart. It is with much pride that I know I have instilled in him a love and devotion for helping and changing the lives of others.

My journey, which is a continuous process, has had many momentous stops along the way. Creating the start of TBSNS, knowing that I had a role in its conception is a feeling that cannot be put into words. I will be forever thankful to our director, and friend Lori Scott for supporting me and always encouraging me to set the bar for what an early childhood center should be. To the many teachers that I have taught with throughout the years- thank you! Together we have truly made a difference. And most of all, to the students that I have had the honor of teaching- you have taught me the biggest lesson of all; to see the world through your eyes with endless hope, innocence and delight.

We will also be celebrating Purim at the Purim Party sponsored by Brotherhood and the Temple Youth Group. This is also a highlight for the children every year!

March also brings our Art Auction on March 10 to raise money for the Nursery School and Table to Table.

I want to thank in advance all of the people who are working so hard to make this event a success. I hope to see many of you there that night and thank you personally.

Meet the TBS Teachers . . .

Marilyn Silberglied

All little girls have dreams and ambitions about what their life will be when they grow up. Some girls want to be ballet dancers, others want to be princesses, and still others want to be mommies. But I always wanted to be a teacher. The chalk dust must have gotten into my bloodstream at a very tender age! I have never regretted that decision.

After graduating college I taught 4th grade in what is now known as the East Ramapo School District. My first 3 years in the district were spent in the North Main Street School. While teaching at that school I married the love of my life, Bob. I then spent another 3 years at the district's Grandview School, and I even graduated to 5th grade! My next career move was to become a full-time mommy. Steven was our first-born and 3 years later Russell added joy to our lives.

By the time Russell started school I was ready to go back to teaching. That was accomplished by taking a job at The Riverdale Temple Nursery School. A pattern was going to emerge! I taught 4-year old and kindergarten classes. In the summers I became the director of the camp program. As our boys started growing we were ready to move to larger quarters. We bought our house in New City after investigating the advantages and disadvantages of many suburban areas. Once we moved into the Rockland area I began substitute teaching in East Ramapo School District. A friend of mine worked at Temple Rodolph Sholom in NYC. On occasion I commuted with her to do sub work at that school. I also taught for 3 years at Temple Beth El Nursery School in Spring Valley. It has been my pleasure to have been here for the past 25 years. In fact, I have the distinction of being the first 4-year-old teacher hired for the program. I have been here such a long time that I have taught almost ½ of the nursery school staff's children.

My purpose of teaching this age group is to help the children acquire a lifelong love and commitment to Judaism. I do this by teaching the holidays through crafts, stories, music and games. In addition, I try to prepare the children to develop skills that they will need to be successful in secular school. I usually become so attached to my students and they are so much a part of my life that I repeat all the clever things the children say and do to my family and friends.
