Marian Wood has volunteered to serve and will try to learn Desktop Publishing. Neil Rosenthal has stepped forward to help out, especially to assist Marian Fass with proof-reading. However, as of now, we do not have anyone to do The Lamp in Desktop Publisher format.

Our solutions are as follows:

1. Since the September issue contains much important beginning-of-the-year information, we really

must get something out to congregants.

2. Since content and speed are often better than appearance for communication, we opted to produce the first issue in Microsoft Word.

3. The TBS website will have all of the information that is in the Lamp. You can visit the site and download what you need.

4. Additionally, to save on paper and mailing costs, as well as to face up to the information technology changes in our society, we are almost ready to send individual congregants the Lamp electronically. Over the next month, we will contact all members (likely via our monthly billing system so as to save on postage) with a request form to elect to receive the Lamp via mail or electronically.

From the desk of .....Rabbi David E. Fass: **Believing is Seeing**

If someone shows us, often with slow-motion replay, that the guy trying to steal second base really was out, we reluctantly believe it. Seeing is believing, right? But boy, did we believe he was safe the first time we saw the play. Why were we wrong? We wanted him to be safe, so we believed he was safe. We believed our team should win, so that's what we saw. Our beliefs are the filters through which we see the world. In other words, just as much as seeing is believing, perhaps even more so, believing is seeing.

One of the most important things we do at this time of year, at this time of the High Holydays is to take an inventory of who we are, and much of that who we are is what we believe. What do we believe about God? Ourselves? Prayer? Ritual? Israel? Judaism? Life and death?

For some things it may be better to believe as we already believe, to see what we already see. For others it may be time to challenge some of these things, and perhaps change some of our beliefs.

An old story says that there were three devils, who set out to conquer the world by playing to people's beliefs.

The first devil went around proclaiming the message, "There is no God!" But even though a few people acted as if there was no God, they knew in their hearts that this message was not true.

The second devil announced, "There is no sin!" And again, although many people acted as if the message were true, they knew deep down that it wasn't.

The third devil was smarter than the other two. He didn't attempt to change people's beliefs. He made no attempt to argue against their deepest convictions. He simply said, "There is no hurry."

But there is. The unexamined life is not part of being a Jew. These High Holydays the sermons will explore the beliefs we use to create the world we see, for Believing is Seeing.

From our house to yours, Marian joins me in wishing you and everyone you love a year of meaningful work, a loving family, caring friends, spiritual growth, good health, God's blessings, and peace for us, for all Israel, and for all the world.

## President's Column:

Mark and I are on vacation in Ogunquit, Maine as I write this. It's our "last hurrah" before the blur that is always the end of the summer hits us. The girls are coming home from sleep away camp soon. In less than three weeks Katie will start her sophomore year of college at a new place – Syracuse University's Newhouse School for Public Communications – and shortly after that, Jenny will begin her junior year at South H.S. It's a time of transition in my family – Mark and I aren't yet empty nesters, but that stage of life is fast approaching and I can't even comprehend how fast the time has flown. I haven't even lost my pregnancy weight yet!

Similarly, it's almost impossible to believe that I've finished the first half of my term as President of our Temple. I started over a year ago in June with a strong sense of what needed to be accomplished and the confidence that I knew what to expect. Turns out I didn't have a clue. Well, maybe that's an overstatement. But it is accurate to say that my focus has changed a bit, and the priorities of our Board of Trustees have shifted. We've all finally acknowledged, albeit reluctantly, that the changing demographics in Rockland County dictate that we take a serious look at the bigger picture and prepare for the future from a position of strength.

We've been living, financially and otherwise, as a congregation of 650 or so families. Which would be fine, except for the fact that we're no

longer that size --we're now a congregation of about 420 families. We have to figure out how to live as a smaller congregation and get our expenses more in line with our revenue, while still retaining our essential character and embracing the values and goals set forth in our Mission Statement. That will involve more than just making budget cuts and increasing fundraising efforts, which our Board has begun to do in a serious way this year.

In addition to, or as an alternative to the above, we have to be willing to seriously consider the possibility of merger with one or more of the Reform congregations in our community. At the very least, we have to strengthen our ties to the larger Jewish community and be willing to look at joint programming with other congregations in connection with our schools and other areas. That will defray costs, expand our resources, and make all of us stronger. To that end, the Presidents of all the Reform Temples in Rockland have been building a relationship with one another over the last year, and are continuing to meet and talk about issues of common concern on a regular basis.

There's a lot to do this year, but we're up to the task. May we move from strength to strength together as a congregation in the year ahead. My family and I wish all of you and yours a sweet New Year filled with good health and happiness!
